Doggie Bags By The Madonio Animal Trust


DOGGIE BAGS NOW GOING FULL SPEED AHEAD

Thanks to the efforts of our friends from Family and Community Services, and in particular Heather Lalibert and Brian Higgins, the Doggie Bags program is off and running. We believe that everyone should have a fully belly – no matter how many legs they have! Doggie Bags provides pet food for owners who are already struggling with food insecurity. Portage County pet owners who receive meals from the Ravenna Center of Hope, Kent Social Services or Mobile Meals are eligible to receive free pet food from the Doggie bags program. "I am a homeless veteran and I live in my car and cannot go to the shelters

because they do not accept dogs. I have no income; I depend on the Center for my food. Now that I can get food for my dog, I do not have to give up my dog. I am hugely thankful" – Mark. Donations can be made directly to this program – either monetary or bags of pet food – to LaJoyce Harris directly through the Ravenna Center of Hope, to Marquis Seward at Kent Social Services, or at the Brimfield Insurance Agency. We don't want any hungry pets in Portage County!

NEW BOOK TO BENEFIT TRUST

In November, Chas published his first book, *Bars, Bands & Rock 'n Roll,* through the Kent Historical Society. All proceeds are being split equally between the Kent Historical Society and the Madonio Animal Trust (MAT). To date, over 1,000 copies have been sold. DISBURSMENTS FROM THE FUND

Despite a brutal year on the market, we were nonetheless able to make a number of disbursements to some of our favorite animal causes. Top of the list this year was \$3,400 to Family & Community Services to restart the Doggie Bags program. Here are the other donation made: Portage County Animal Protective League \$2,000; Rose's Rescue \$2,000; Happy Trails Farm Animal Sanctuary \$1,500: Portage County Dog Warden \$1,000; Tree City Cats \$500; People Care Pet Pantry \$500.
